

Parent Information

Welcome to Nursery!

Settling in:

In September, you will have a short time slot where you attend the Nursery with your child, allowing your child to become familiar with the staff and setting, while you are there to support.

For the following few days, the children will attend the Nursery in small groups. This allows the staff to get to know the children, and the children to become familiar with the routine.

Finally, all the children will attend the Nursery sessions together. If during this time you feel your child needs more support, please speak to a member of Nursery staff.

Getting ready for Nursery:

To help your child get ready, please support your child with the following:

Taking off and putting on their coat

Taking off shoes and putting on wellies

Going to the toilet

Washing their hands

Useful things to remember:

The day runs from 8.45 am -11.45am for all Nursery children.

Please ensure you drop off and collect your child at these times.

If you are late, you will need to take your child to the office in the Infant building so they can be signed in.

If your child is being collected by someone else, please inform us in the morning.

Please put regular arrangements in writing.

Uniform/ Equipment:

The children spend a lot of time outdoors so please make sure your child has suitable clothing for all weathers, including raincoat, scarf, hat and gloves, sun hat and so on. You can leave a pair of wellies in the cloakroom for your child to use on wet days.

Uniform is not compulsory but please make sure all items are named.

It is useful for your child to have a bag on their peg. School bookbags are available from our online supplier, www.pmgsschoolwear.co.uk. Please check these bags frequently as letters are often put in the bags, and they will also contain library books, once we begin to send these home.

Named water bottles should be sent in every day. We will send them home every day for cleaning.

Weekly routines:

The weekly timetable will be available on the school website and also in the Nursery window. Once the children have settled we will use the hall for PE. The children do not need a PE kit.

If you would like to help us change our library books or help in the classroom in other ways such as cooking, helping the children with activities or helping to prepare resources please speak to a member of Nursery staff in September. You will need to have completed the DBS form (available from the school office) before you can do this.

We will plan cooking activities for some weeks, and we may ask for parent helpers! We do ask for a donation of 50p per week to cover the cost of consumables such as ingredients, play dough, items for sticking, gardening and so on.

We put the tin out each morning so please pop some coins in when you can.

Suggested home activities will be emailed each Friday. These are not compulsory but they will support what your child has been learning in Nursery.

Getting to know you:

Please complete this with your child and bring it to Nursery in September. It gives us a picture of what they like to do at home, what they are able to do and what they need help with.
