<p>Communication, Language and Literacy</p> <p><i>Practise the poem for Poetry Day. Have a go at performing it to someone in your family when you have started to learn it.</i></p> <p><i>Use a paintbrush and water to paint your name and other words/ letters you know.</i></p> <p><i>Read a book at bed-time and discuss the story with your child.</i></p>	<p>Maths</p> <p><i>Learn some new number rhymes or songs. You could sing them to us at school.</i></p> <p><i>Hunt for numbers on your way to school. Look on doors, buses, car number plates etc.</i></p> <p><i>Collect boxes of different shapes and sizes. How many cubes can you fit in each box? What shapes can you see on the boxes?</i></p>
<p>Understanding the World</p> <p><i>Talk about the different seasons. Bring in something for the season table in your classroom.</i></p>	<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p><i>Make up a dance to your favourite song.</i></p> <p><i>Make an autumn collage using natural objects e.g. leaves.</i></p>
<p>Physical Development</p> <p><i>Find new and different ways to be active for twenty minutes every day at home. Tell your teacher what you have decided to do.</i></p> <p><i>Support fine motor development by building with lego, threading, using play dough and holding scissors properly.</i></p>	<p>Other</p> <p><i>If you have a keyboard at home, practise typing your name and learn where the letters are.</i></p> <p><i>If you have a computer with a mouse, practise using the mouse.</i></p> <p><i>Use a knife and fork to cut your own food.</i></p> <p><i>Get dressed and undressed by yourself.</i></p>
